Section 3 – Hazards Identification: CORROSIVE

Emergency Overview: This product is highly corrosive and acidic in nature. This product can irritate, redden and burn skin, eyes, and other contaminated tissue. This product is not flammable; however, if exposed to high temperatures, toxic decomposition products (e.g., phosphine, phosphorus compounds) will be generated. Flammable hydrogen gas may be generated by contact with metals. This solution will generate a small amount of heat when in contact with water. Persons who respond to releases of this product must protect themselves from inhalation of acidic vapors and mists from this product, especially in areas which are downwind of the spill. Extreme caution must be used when responding to spill. Emergency responders must wear the PPE suitable for the situation, which they are responding to.

Route(s) of Entry: Eyes, Inhalation, Skin and Ingestion

Health Hazards (Acute and Chronic):

Inhalation: Inhalation of mists or spray of this product may cause pulmonary irritation, irritation of the mucous membranes, coughing, laryngitis, headache, nausea, vomiting and a sore throat. Prolonged overexposures or exposures to high concentrations of mists or sprays of this solution may damage the tissues of the respiratory system. Severe overexposures can cause pulmonary edema, chemical pneumonitis and other adverse health consequences. Chronic exposure to the vapors of this product can cause dental erosion. Severe overexposures may be fatal.

Eyes: Eye contact can cause irritation, pain, reddening and blindness.

Skin: Skin contact can cause reddening, discomfort, irritation, chemical burns, blistering of the skin and scarring. Repeated skin overexposures can cause dermatitis (dry, red skin). Skin Absorption is not a significant route of exposure for any component of this product.

Ingestion: Ingestion is not anticipated to be a likely route of exposure to this product. If this product is swallowed, it can irritate and burn the mouth, throat esophagus and other tissue of the digestive system. Symptoms of such overexposure can include nausea, vomiting and diarrhea. Ingestion of large volumes of this product may be fatal.

Section 4 – First Aid Measures

Inhalation: Remove person to fresh air and support breathing as needed. Seek medical attention

if irritation persists.

Ingestion: Have a *conscious* person drink 1 to 2 glasses of water or milk to dilute. Have victim

rinse mouth with water, if conscious. SEEK MEDICAL ATTENTION OR CALL A POISON CONTROL CENTER IMMEDIATELY. DO NOT

INDUCE VOMITING, unless directed by medical personnel.

Eyes: Flush with clean water for at least 15 minutes. Lift eyelids to facilitate irrigation.

Seek medical attention if eye irritation persists.

Skin: Immediately remove contaminated clothing and wash before re-using. Flush skin

with water for at least 15 minutes, and then wash with soap and water. Seek medical

attention if skin becomes irritated.

After first aid, get appropriate in-plant, paramedic, or community medical support.

Unusual Fire and Explosion Hazards: This product is corrosive and presents a severe contact hazard to firefighters. When involved in a fire and exposed to extremely high temperatures, this product will decompose to produce acidic vapors and toxic gases (e.g., phosphine, phosphorous oxides). Flammable hydrogen gas may be generated by contact with metals. This solution will generate a small amount of heat when in contact with water.

<u>Section 6 – Accidental Release Measures</u>

Release Response: In case of a release, clear the affected area and protect people. Uncontrolled releases should be responded to by appropriately trained personnel in proper PPE, using pre-planned procedures. In terms of **SMALL, INCIDENTAL RELEASES** (e.g., 1 gallon from a leaking container), the minimum PPE should be as follows: gloves, goggles, face shield and appropriate body protection (e.g., boots, Tyvek suit). Section 7 – Precautions for Safe Handling and Use

Precautions to Be taken in Handling and Storing: Store in cool, dry places away from direct sunlight and high sources of heat, or where freezing is possible. Store away from incompatible materials. Material should be stored in secondary containers or in a diked area, as appropriate. Use corrosion-resistant structural materials, lighting and ventilation system in storage area. Floors should be sealed to prevent absorption of this material. Keep container tightly closed when not in use. Keep away from children, feed and food products. Immediately clean up spills that occur during handling or storage.

Other Precautions: Consult local, State and Federal regulations pertaining to storage and disposal.
